Fishing at the Jubilee Pond, Gilberdyke

Gilberdyke Parish Council manages the village (Jubilee) pond on behalf of our residents, and fishing at the pond as an asset for the benefit of the community. It takes this responsibility very seriously in protecting and managing this lovely asset and preserving its beauty and availability as a leisure facility for future generations is an absolute priority for Parish Councillors.

To ensure the above, the Parish Council will be introducing a Permit Managed scheme for any fishing conducted at the pond with effect from November 2020. From this date anyone wishing to fish at the pond will require a fishing permit and will need to sign an agreement to abide by a number of conditions put in place to protect the pond, fish stock and respect local residents at all times whilst fishing.

Conditions of Fishing at the Jubilee Pond

1. Young people under the age of 16 do not require a permit, although are expected to observe all the other conditions of fishing at the pond
2. Drinking of alcohol is not permitted at the pond and anyone found doing so will be asked to stop and if they do not, they will be required to leave
3. Night time fishing is not permitted at the pond – this means dawn to dusk
4. Anyone fishing at the pond should have their permit available for inspection at any time by the appointed bailiff. Any person without a permit will be asked to leave.
5. Anyone fishing at the pond should be respectful of residents and refrain from noise, loud music and any form of anti-social behaviour. Persistent breaches of this requirement will mean the fishing permit is removed by the Parish Council
6. Only approved fishing will be permitted at the pond: this means -
 - 6.1 No boilies or floating baits
 - 6.2 Landing nets and disgorgers must be used
 - 6.3 No braided lines to be used
 - 6.4 Keep nets are not permitted
 - 6.5 Only barbless hooks can be used
7. All fishes caught at the pond must be immediately returned to the water. Under no circumstances should any fish be taken away
8. The Permit Holder must not fish with any other person who does not hold a permit – excluding young people under 16

ANY PERSISTENT BREACHES OF THE ABOVE CONDITIONS OR PERSISTENT REFUSAL TO USE A PERMIT WILL MEAN THE PARISH COUNCIL REPORTING INDIVIDUALS TO THE POLICE AS A MATTER OF THEFT
